DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

In addition to responding to emergencies, Volunteer Firefighters also perform daily station maintenance, apparatus & equipment maintenance, assist with community education programs, assist with business inspections, conduct regular training, fire prevention, maintain physical fitness, and other related duties.





Volunteer Firefighter Program

The Volunteer Firefighter program is a part-time training program to provide men and women who wish to pursue a career in the fire service with valuable on the job training and experience.

Volunteers will have the opportunity to apply their acquired skills and knowledge while gaining insight into what it takes to become a career firefighter. The role of the Volunteer Firefighter is to assist the Fire Department, under the direct supervision of their assigned Captain, in a variety of emergencies including, but not limited to: Structure fires, Medical Emergencies, Traffic Collisions, Rescues and Fire Alarms. The Volunteer Firefighter will also participate in non-emergency calls, such as public education and public relations. Volunteers are required to work a minimum of two 24 hour shifts per calendar month and must attend two drills a month.

THE DISTRICT

The American Canyon Fire Protection District (“District”) was formally recognized by the State of California in 1957. The District’s response area is approximately 15 square miles and protects a population of approximately 20,000. The District is a combination fire department comprised of paid and volunteer firefighters.



Services the District Provides

Providing a high level of Fire Suppression, ALS, EMS, and Rescue services to the community is the priority, with a multitude of specially developed programs designed to meet this challenge. The District is also recognized by the California Office of Emergency Services as a Type I US & R single resource (“heavy rescue”).

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- Eighteen years of age or older
- High School Diploma or G.E. D.
- A resident of the district or close proximity. The following counties are considered to be within close proximity: Napa, Solano, Contra Costa, Sonoma, Marin, and Yolo
- Physically and mentally fit
- Maintain a minimum Class C Driver’s License
- Medically cleared by Occupational Medicine
- Clear background check (live scan)
- Possess and maintain a minimum of Advanced First Aid and CPR Certification

Additional Qualifications

- California E.M.T. 1 Certification (highly desirable)
- Completion of Firefighter 1 Academy (highly desirable)
